Thought from the Rectory



New Year's celebrations. Think about Lent. What are you giving up? Before you know it, it's Easter. Big celebration! Too much chocolate. Into the summer. Hot. Holidays. Sun and seasides. Back to school. Autumn, falling leaves, frown at the Halloween decorations in Sainsbury's. Suddenly it's Advent and we're getting ready for Christmas, the end of another year.

I don't know how 2025 has been for you, but it certainly seems to have been a blur to me. As we gear up for Advent 2025, and even for what's to come in the New Year, it's hard not to look back on another year that has flown by.

During Advent, the Church of England follows a sequence of four Sundays to remember the patriarchs and matriarchs, the prophets, John the Baptist and Mary, Jesus' mother. This year, we're also using an alternate sequence that is used by other church traditions: as we light the four Advent candles, we remember Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. In our preparations for Christmas, and at a time when we look forward to Jesus coming again some day, we tell a story of those four things.

Reflecting on this year, it definitely feels good to remember Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. They are all there, if I look back. It's just that I didn't always take the time to notice them. In the busy-ness of the year, in the frenetic pace of life and when trying to balance all the different things we do (church, family, schools, trying to do some exercise, remembering to answer Michael's emails about the newsletter), we sometimes overlook basic things.

This all counts as we look forward to 2026, as well. What do you hope for? What gives you peace? Where will you encounter joy? When might you receive, or need to offer, love?

A final thought. I don't know what Christmas films you reach for each December, but my three I watch every single year are Die Hard (yes, it's a Christmas film and I am absolutely willing to fight over this), Nativity and Home Alone. Maybe it's just because we're searching for those feel-good vibes, but (perhaps leaving Die Hard to the side), so many Christmas films are all about

people searching for those four things: Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. Whether it's George Bailey, consumed by despair but given new hope by the end of the film or Ebenezer Scrooge, setting aside selfish miserliness for shared joy and love with others (I do err towards the muppets' version of A Christmas Carol), these films embody things that, in church, we are finding in the story of Jesus.

Enjoy your Christmas films this year. And I pray that you each find Hope, Peace, Joy and Love, spotting where it showed itself in 2025 and receiving it in present-loads for 2026. *Rev. Chris*

We are so grateful to everyone who supported, in whatever way, the recent Christmas Festive Fayre at St Mary Magdalen's. It was a wonderful turnout and the event raised an amazing £997 (incl donations) for parish funds. Last year's Fayre raised £632. We also raised a further £435 at the Quiz Night - £1,432 in less than a week – that's pretty good going. That's the good news – sadly despite all our best efforts we are still forecasting an end of year deficit of around £15,000. This hasn't been helped by a couple of unforeseen problems at St Mary's recently – the heater in the chancel has had to be replaced and the kitchen roof has had to be repaired after rain water leaked in. The total cost of the heater and roof repairs is about £3,000. Many thanks to everyone who has responded to Chris' letter last week, setting out the financial situation that we now face. Already we have received some very kind one off donations and I know that some of you are reviewing your giving to church. THANKYOU ALL. *Michael*

Special Visitors

On the afternoon of Sunday November 9th at St Katharine's Church in Holt it was such a privilege to meet in person Archbishop Ezekiel of Sudan and Bishop Hassan of the Kadugli Diocese (South Kordofan) – here in the UK to highlight the plight of their war ravaged country.

Following welcomes by the Rev. Andrew Evans, singing and prayer, first the Archbishop and then Bishop Hassan spoke in words very wide-ranging. So

many factions – local, national, international – at war in their land. A very complex picture. Some factions supported by weapons from other nations. So much destruction. 12 million people displaced, many thousands killed. Unspeakable, brutal atrocities.

Questions were then invited. One question: "What are your two main needs?" The Archbishop replied: "Food and Advocacy". (for "Food" read all humanitarian needs). Advocacy – the World has been slow to recognise, to respond to, what many call this "Forgotten War".

The Archbishop and Bishop Hassan were off to Westminster early in the week. On Monday I rang my MP's office asking him to do what he can in Parliament to "raise" the plight and needs of Sudan.

Despite all this darkness what is abundantly clear is the Faith and Hope of these two priests – and of their "flock" – and of how important to them is the link between the Episcopal Church of Sudan and Salisbury Diocese. The Deanery of Bradford on Avon they call Bradford on Heaven. A sentence from the Archbishop which will stay with me: "Our children are your children; your children are our children."

To quote the Archbishop again : "Please do not grow tired of praying for Sudan". Jo Davis

TROWBRIDGE STREET PASTORS

How would you like to have fun with Jesus? Are you being called to help people in need? Would you like to find a different way to talk to people who wouldn't normally go near a church? Then maybe becoming a Street Pastor is exactly what you need to do.



I'll be honest – it is a calling and it is a commitment, including undertaking extensive training, having an interview and a DBS check. We need people who really feel called to go out on the streets of Trowbridge late at night, talking to strangers, listening to them and helping them. You may feel nervous or unsure about it, but do give it a try and see if you perceive that call and, truth be told, we really need you!

There has been a Street Pastors Initiative operating in Trowbridge since 2009, but our numbers have gone down, especially since Covid. Currently we have 9 active Street Pastors and have had to reduce our patrols to every fortnight, on a Saturday night. However, each Street Pastor would, generally, only go out on patrol once a month.

Our Chair, David Goldstone, always says that we have fun with Jesus out on patrol; and that is true. I have seen potentially confrontational situations turn into something completely different, even ending in laughter. We certainly each know that we absolutely could not do this without Jesus being with us, or without the Holy Spirit within us. The Lord himself goes before you and will be with you; He will never leave you nor forsake you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged. Deuteronomy 31:8

One of the great privileges of being a Street Pastor is that we are on the front line between the world and God's Kingdom and we meet people on *their* patch. We can have really good conversations about why we do what we do, for no pay, which is so counter cultural that people are really taken aback. We have the opportunity to show people God's love, in action, which is truly wonderful.
