I once saw the comedian David Mitchell do a piece about Christmas, concluding with the line "But I like my time each year visiting the people of Christmas-land, and they're certainly a lot nicer than their neighbours: the tedious, puritanical, impecunious, miserable people of January-land, who bang on endlessly about their failed diets while shaking with nicotine withdrawal. Good luck getting a present out of those jerks."

There is definitely something strange about the period that follows Christmas, sliding into the memory as swiftly as the cardboard and paper of the presents slide into the recycling box. I am writing this in the week between Christmas and New Year, a strange, suspended time before January starts with celebration, fireworks and cheering. But then that celebration also fades and we're left with January: all the bitterness of deep winter but now all the twinkly lights have been taken away.

Through Advent, we talked a lot about Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. Problem is, with January taking hold, there is a danger that those four can fade as quickly as Christmas. The tree is gone, there's nothing to unwrap, I feel guilty for too many chocolates eaten and I now don't feel at all hopeful, peaceful, joyous or loving. Maybe a challenge to us all is, as Christians, to continue bringing those themes to life even when we don't feel them. While we pack away our Christmas decorations each year, the message of Christmas doesn't need to be packed away. The things we sang in our carols remain true in January and July, just as much as in December. Heaven reaches down and touches earth and Christ is seen among us. The Word becomes flesh and dwells with us. Veiled in flesh, the godhead see: Hail the incarnate deity. Let's all sing Hark! the Herald

Angels Sing during January because those words are just as true and vital to our faith.

Whatever January looks like for you, as we button up our coats against the cold and think about how winter is drawing on, may we all hold to the hope, peace, joy and love that we proclaim in Advent and Christmas. Financial Update for Hilperton and Staverton Parish

In last month's Canalside News I reported that we were heading for a year end deficit of £15,000. Although there is still going to be a deficit we have managed to reduce it to around £11.500. Quite a remarkable reduction and is mainly down to your generosity at recent fundraising, from increased regular giving and very kind one off donations. **THANKYOU.** Despite the deficit we have had quite a successful year in a number of areas: the total raised from Fundraising was £8,458 which is almost double the total for 2024 and regular church giving was just over £5,000 higher than in the previous year. THANKYOU. Unfortunately our income from one off donations, bequests and grants was £24,000 lower than in 2024. Our expenses for the year were around £10,000 higher than in the previous year as a result of the unforeseen heating repairs at St Michael's and likewise at St Mary Magdalen's plus kitchen roof repairs. We have managed to meet all of our financial commitments other than the Parish Share (the amount we pay to the Diocese each year). The total amount due was £50,000 and it now looks like we will only be able to pay £39,000. We are now talking to the Diocese about the deficit and will keep you updated. Christian Healing is something we think we know about when in actual fact on the whole we know very little./ Healing (literally meaning to make whole) is the process of the restoration of health to an unbalanced, diseased or damaged organism. Healing may be physical or psychological and not without the mutual reception of these two dimensions of human health. With respect to physical damage or disease suffered by an organism, healing involves the repair of living tissue, organs and the biological system as a whole and resumption of normal functioning. That is the general opinion of healing.

I believe the Holy Spirit is as ever present today as it was on the day of Pentecost. If you just need some stillness and contemplation after Christmas this might be the time for you.
